

School Counselor Desk Reference

Rutgers welcomes applications from students who demonstrate preparedness for our academic programs. The number of students we admit is determined by the number of spaces available in each entering class, the number of students who apply, and the quality of the applicant pool. These factors change from year to year and vary with each Rutgers school.

The charts below indicate the SAT and ACT score ranges and grade-point averages for the middle 50% of high school students admitted to Rutgers for fall 2014. We conduct a holistic review of each student's application that takes into consideration many more factors than test scores and cumulative grade-point average.
