TIPS FOR PLANNING YOUR DAY

- **1. Look carefully at the schedule and plan ahead.** Events happen throughout the entire day. To avoid early morning traffic you may want to consider alternate routes or carpool with friends.







NEXT STEPS FOR FUTURE SCARLET KNIGHTS

New Student Orientation (NSO)

New Student Orientation is a dynamic on-campus experience designed to welcome, prepare and engage all new students and their families in their transition to Rutgers.

- » All new students are expected to attend an orientation program.
- » There is no additional cost for New Student Orientation.
- » Students should make sure that they activate their NetID through the Enrollment Pathway and regularly monitor their NetID and ScarletMail email accounts.
- » Students are encouraged to select an orientation session date on the Enrollment Pathway by June 1, 2017. Space is limited and sessions are filled on a first come, first served basis.
- » Separate orientation programs will be offered for parents and family members that require separate registration and a nominal fee for attendance. Parents and family members may purchase tickets for a Parent and Family Orientation program at getinvolved.tix.com.

Students will attend a two-day program with one overnight stay in a university residence hall. Session dates run from mid-June through mid-August with some priority session dates for Honors College, School of Environmental and Biological Sciences, engineering, and nursing students. Students enrolled at the Rutgers Business School, Mason Gross School of the Arts, School of Arts and Sciences, and Ernest Mario School of Pharmacy may attend any session.

TRANSFER AND NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENTS

Students will attend a half-day program. Since some transfer or non-traditional students may be looking for additional information about campus involvement opportunities, select session dates will include options for an extended evening or an overnight orientation experience. In addition, one session date in early August will feature a consolidated evening program specifically designed for non-traditional or working students with significant daytime commitments.
